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What is Title I?

Skyview High School is identified as a Title I school as part of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with family members a written parent and family engagement plan.

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Skyview High School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. How is it revised?

Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Community Health and Career events in the Spring and Fall.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Skyview High will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.
